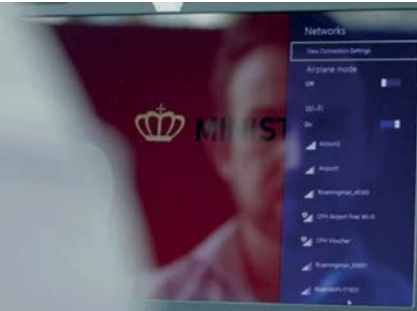


## Good security culture

The course “Good security culture” enhances security awareness and improves the security culture.



Denmark is continuously exposed to espionage and influence by foreign states. They attempt to collect classified or sensitive information – i.e. information that may damage Denmark’s sovereignty, values and interests if it ends up in the wrong hands. National and international cases highlight that the threat is serious. Therefore, staff security awareness and conduct are crucial to the protection of information.



### Objective

The course improves security by increasing the employees’ shared understanding of a good security culture.

### Outcome

The course introduces the participants to the “toolbox” of intelligence services and to the importance of the human factor when working with security. The participants learn to prevent and handle incidents that may compromise classified or sensitive information. The participants will return to work with an improved security awareness and a common frame of reference for a good security culture.

### Target group

The course targets staff working with classified or sensitive information. The course was developed for central government staff, but staff in private companies and institutions working with intellectual property rights or other sensitive information may also benefit from the course.



## Content

The course introduces the participants to current threats from foreign espionage and influence as well as to how foreign states collect information through social media, compromised IT networks and recruited sources.

Six short films introduce these themes in recognizable situations from everyday life, inviting the participants to reflect on their own behaviour compared with the behaviour shown in the films. Based on the films, plenary discussions and presentations by PET, the participants work on defining a good security culture for them and their organization.

## Practical information

- The duration of the course is four hours.

- The course is intended for groups of 20-40 participants in order that they may derive optimum benefit from the dialogue, knowledge sharing and dilemma exercises.
- PET will hold the course a number of times if required by an organization.
- There are no course requirements other than active attendance.
- A room with presentation facilities is required, allowing the instructor to connect a laptop and to play films with sound.
- Ideally, it should be possible to set up tables for five groups.
- The course is free of charge.
